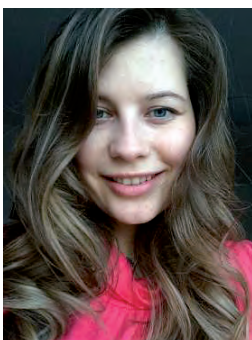
Olha Zarechnyuk Center for Urban History of East Central Europe Lviv, vul. Akad. Bohomoltsia 6/2.

She has researched and published articles on history of architecture and descriptions of individual buildings built in Lviv mostly from mid-nineteenth century until First World War. She participated as author in historical exhibitions at the Center, including The Past in “Digital”: The City, History, and Digital Technology (2014), curated photoexhibition Secession in Masks (2015), co-authored *Noviy Lviv: Amongst Parks and the Railway* (2016), was curator and editor of the interactive map *Modernism in Lviv*, which was prepared as part of exhibition “Lviv, 24th June 1937. City, Architecture, Modernism” at the Museum of Architecture in Wroclaw (2016). In 2018, she took part in the Meeting of European Cities and Sites “Modern Movement in Architecture – an Asset to Cultural Heritage: a Central-Eastern Europe Perspective” in Kaunas, Lithuania, as well as scientific seminar “Heritage Activism in Cities of Eastern Europe and Russia from 1968 to the Current” at the Herder Institute in Marburg, Germany. Currently (2019) she researches the milieu of architects-professors of the Habsburg Higher Technical School in Lviv (1870s–1910s), and has recently published a web-page about renowned Lviv architect and entrepreneur Ivan Levynskyi.
